GHANA TOGETHER GUIDING PRINCIPLES

Adopted by Ghana Together Board, May 2008

- 1. Ensure the on-going success of existing projects by prioritizing appropriate funding and management attention as needed, above what might otherwise be focused on new projects.
- 2. Prioritize projects that address basic human needs (health, education for example) above those that address "needs" that are not core to the community's survival and well being.
- 3. Projects should be highly leveraged so they have the highest positive impact on the most people. In other words, keep an eye on the cost/benefit of the project (i.e. bang for the buck).
- 4. Use the special skills of our group as a starting point.
- 5. Balance projects so the benefit is shared among a wide group of people. We don't want a "haves and have-nots" division developing in the community.
- 6. Engage in projects with an overriding theme of helping Ghanaians help themselves. "Hand-over" the projects rather than give "hand-outs" (This is directly in line with our Mission statement).
